- 1. Call to Order. Chair Peter Majane called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

The question was asked who is going to onboard Eleanor into the new position given that Lillian hasn't had a YS Director filled for much of her tenure and YS is a Department of one. ## **Department Operations**

Youth Services wristbands and kindness-themed temporary tattoos were given out at Town Day 9/17 at a table staffed by the Commission on Disabilities.

The Flint Memorial Library hired Emily Klesaris as Program Coordinator 9/13, and Senior Center hired Jackie Quinn as part-time Program/Volunteer Coordinator 9/11. This cohort may orient together, building connections between departments.

CIT Social Services Action Team will meet 9/19 to update a list of financial assistance resources for North Reading families, shared within the local provider network and once finalized, to be published online and in a printed North Reading Resource Guide.

CIT substance use prevention funding is available for Youth Services to re-convene a Youth Action Team.

Intergenerational Center staff wish lists went to the Facilities Master Plan workgroup on 5/8 after all associated committees reviewed them. This is a resident-led committee with staff taking a backseat role. Anyone interested in championing this facility, please let Lil or Abby Hurlbut know.

Updates to the IRP Skate Park are set to begin the week of Sept. 18, due to be completed in October.
