

The FY2025 budget proposal reflects changes to better support our older adult population being served




Senior Center Van Rides 2022 compared to 2023

Priority Initiative: Implement a market rate adjustment of \$8,963.00 for part time van drivers


PARTICIPATION RATES: PROGRAMMING

PARTICIPATION RATES: MEAL/NUTRITION PROGRAM





Fun Facts: 720 residents attend center programs regularly, there were 399 new participants in 2023, and 49 new participants since January 2024.

By the year 2030, 35% of North Reading residents will be age 60 and older.

Population projection is based on figures from the Donahue Institute documented in the August 2021 Age Friendly NR Community Needs Assessment completed by UMass Boston Center for Social & Demographic Research on Aging
